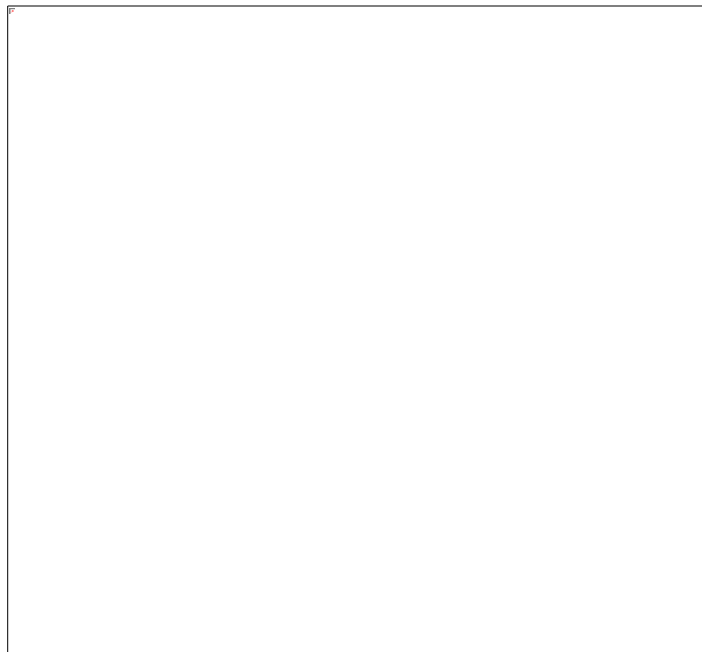

Q: One of my associates has an account on America Online. I would like to be able to send him Email from my Freenet [Internet] account. How can I do this? - *Michael B., Tonawanda NY.*

A: You can send Internet mail to users on most of the major online services, but you have to format the Email address properly to include the service provider's *domain name*. For example, to send to username "Joe" on America Online, you would address it to *Joe@aol.com*. The same holds for Prodigy (*Joe@prodigy.com*) and Delphi (*Joe@delphi.com*). For CompuServe, send to the proper user number, but change the comma to a period, such as *1111.22222@compuserve.com*. Call us if you need more help.
