Q: Some of my associates are able to send Email to each other through the Internet using Microsoft Mail and their in-house company networks. How can I do this from my company's network? > Thomas, Buffalo NY

A: Thomas, some larger companies have what are known as Internet gateways for their in-house local area networks. With these gateways, employees can send mail to each other over the Internet, or any other online services through which your company has contracted. Consult your network administrator for more information on what kinds of services are available to you. Chances are, however, that your in-house network may not have any gateways, and you'll have to get your own personal Internet connection through a service provider.

Q: How do I find OJ Simpson on the Internet? > Don, Buffalo NY

Q: I am getting an error message that says, "not enough drive letters," when my system boots. What can I do to fix it?

A: This error is caused because some device driver is trying to install another drive, yet DOS is out of drive letters. To fix this, simply go into your CONFIG.SYS file, and make sure you have the line "LASTDRIVE=Z" listed. If not, add it close to the top of the file. This will give DOS up to 26 drive letters to utilize.

Q: I deleted some files on my hard drive (by accident) that I need to get back, but Undelete says BAD COMMAND OR

FILENAME. What can I do? I absolutely *must* have these files back now!

A: There could be several reasons why Undelete isn't working. First, of all, check to make sure you have a version of DOS that has Undelete in it (if you have an older version, like 3.3, you will not have Undelete). Secondly, check to make sure that your DOS directory is in your search path, i.e. type "PATH" at a DOS prompt. Make sure that the directory that has UNDELETE.EXE in it (usually your DOS directory) is listed. If not, add it to the PATH= statement in your AUTOEXEC.BAT and reboot. If you don't have Undelete available, you will need a third-party undelete utility. We recommend The Norton Utilities. As always, if you cannot figure out what's going on, give us a call.
