**Q:** I recently had a second hard drive installed. The new drive is now drive D: and my old drive is C:. Is there any way that I can easily switch their drive letter designations? > *Don, Amherst NY*

**A:** Yes, they can be switched, but it is not easy. You would have to change the "jumper" settings (little switches) on the hard drives to make your new drive the "master" and the old drive the "slave." After this is done, you have to go into your CMOS setup (your system's startup info) and tell the computer what the new hard drive setup is. Then, you'll have to format your new C: drive as a "bootable" disk and transfer your information over from your old drive. So as you can see, it's possible, but not very simple. **A:** Yes, she was. There is a specific kind of virus called a "Word Macro Virus." It uses Microsoft Word's ability to automatically play a "macro" - or sequence of actions - when you load a document. A couple of real nasty macro viruses have been discovered. You can protect against them by downloading a patch from Microsoft's web site. You can also protect against some of them by making your default document template a "read only" file. Go to your Word directory and type "ATTRIB +R

**A:** Some viruses, Tom, infect the "master boot record" of your hard drive. This is the place where various system-level information about your hard drive and partitions is stored. Unfortunately, in order to clean the virus, you're going to have to wipe the master boot record (which will destroy any data on your disk). In order to do this boot off of a clean DOS disk and type "FDISK /MBR". You won't notice anything happen, but your master boot record will be erased. You can then repartition and reformat your hard drive. Have fun reinstalling your applications and data. > *Don*
