Nevertheless, we have recently tested and approved the new Cyrix M2 processors. These chips give near-Pentium II performance for a fraction of the cost, and are compatible with a lot of older systems. **Q:** The machines in our office are just too darn slow, but we don't have the budget available to buy all new \$2000 top-of-the-line systems. All we're doing is word processing, accounting, and such. What do you recommend? >Allen, Cheektowaga NY

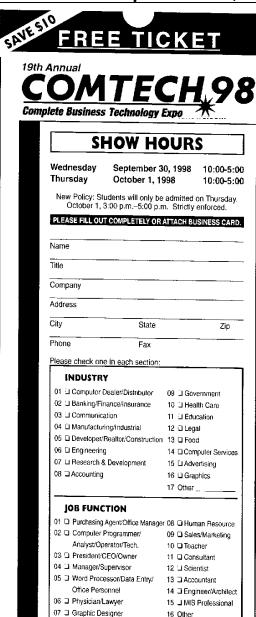
A: Allen, join the club. You're not alone in the race to try and stay current. Although the big computer manufacturers and retailers don't want to admit it, the average business does not need the biggest and best Pentium II system. In fact, second best is usually the best buy - and it will still meet your needs for several years to come. Here's what we recommend for the average business machine: P233-300 processor (standard Pentium-class, don't bother with Pentium II), 32 MB of RAM, 2-3 GB hard drive, 4 MB Video. Skip the sound card, and if you have a network in your office, you can even skip the CD-ROM drive. And, chances are you can even use your old system's monitor (they can last 5 to 10 years). We have a system which is perfect for your needs. We call it our Alpha system, and it's only \$699, perfect for any budget. We also have leasing available. **PS:** If you're noticing poor performance in your office, you may just need some preventative maintenance performed on your computers.
