Q: When I purchased my computer, I supposedly bought a modem that can send faxes. How does this work? I don't see anywhere to insert the paper. >*Andrew, Amherst NY*

A: Andrew, when you purchase a fax-modem, you have the capability to send documents that you have created on your computer – such as with your word processor. If you want to send a page that you already have printed out, you'll need to purchase a scanner to scan that image into your computer first. On a related note, Symantec just released **WinFax 9.0**, the latest upgrade to their popular fax software. It's *excellent*. Finally, they have included peer-to-peer network capabilities in WinFax. This means you can fax from any machine on your network – and you only need one PC with a fax-modem and phone line. For details, call and request document **810053**. *>Don*

Q: I am trying to run a tape backup, but I keep getting the error message "media not formatted." What does this mean? > *Debbie*, *Hamburg NY*

A: Debbie, this just means you need to *format* the tape you're trying to save your data on. Generally, most tapes and floppy disks you buy are already formatted at the factory. Some, however, must be formatted manually before you can save to them. If you're using a program like *Seagate Backup Exec* or some other popular backup program, click on Tools > Media > Format (or something similar). This will prepare the tape to accept data, and may take an hour or so. *Warning:* make sure there is nothing on this tape that you want to save! Q: I heard from one of my associates that there is an update available for Microsoft Office 97. Is this correct? If so, how do I get it? > Douglas, Cheektowaga NY

A: Yes, there actually have been two service releases (SR1 and SR2) released for Office 97. They fix some *serious* bugs in the software – especially some calculation errors in Microsoft Excel. We highly recommend both updates for our customers. You can obtain them from Microsoft's Web Site (www.microsoft.com). They're about 20 MB each (about 4 hours of download). You can also contact Microsoft for a copy on CD (the wait is about 4 to 6 weeks). Or, if you prefer, we can install the upgrade for you. Q: Can Microsoft Word's AutoSave feature be disabled? It comes up every few minutes, and I have a slow computer – which makes it annoying. > *Clyde, Buffalo NY*

A: We recommend you leave the AutoSave feature enabled, and just move it up to, say, 10 minutes or so. This means your work will be automatically saved every 10 minutes. If you want to disable it completely, however, just click on Tools > Options > Save Tab. Clear the check in the box that reads "Save AutoRecover info every." Again, we recommend you just set this to 10 or 15 minutes. You'll thank us if your system crashes and you lose your work! > *Iain*
