Q: I recently tried dragging a folder from my desktop down to my TaskBar to create a shortcut for it and I instead got a whole bunch of icons on the TaskBar instead. What happened, and how do I fix it? >Ann, Derby NY

A: In Windows 98, when you drag a folder and drop it on your ShortCut Bar (generally directly above or to the left of your actual TaskBar) Windows creates a shortcut to that folder. However, if you drag the folder and drop it on your TaskBar, you will get a whole new bar that includes the contents of the folder you were dragging. It's really very useful. Q: In Microsoft Word, is there an easier way to resize my fonts than clicking on the toolbar box and changing the little number? >Timothy, Buffalo NY

A: Timothy, what you can do is highlight the text you'd like to resize, and then press CTRL-[or CTRL-] (the left and right square-bracket keys) to resize the text. If you'd like to learn more, request document **001202**. > *Richard*

A: The sound was most likely caused by a fan that's starting to die. You have several fans inside your computer: a processor cooling fan, a fan for your power supply, and sometimes (like in the PCs we sell) one or more additional case fans. These can sometimes fail if they get too dusty. You can try opening up your case (careful not to void any warranties) and using a can of compressed air, blow out any dust inside your machine and in your fans.
