Q: I'm printing a long document in Word that I would like to spiral bind and hand out to my clients. The problem is that I'm doing double-sided prints, and the page numbers all come out on the wrong side of the page for the even pages. How can I get the odd pages to put the page numbers on one side of the page, and the even numbers on the other? > Sue, Hamburg

A: Sue, you can't do this easily with the *Insert* > Page Numbers feature in Word. A technique we teach in our Word course is to create page headers and footers, then go into File > Page Setup and tell Word to use "different odd and even" page headers and footers. Q: I'm trying to get the total of a column of values in an Access report using the SUM function. I could swear I've done it correctly, but Access keeps giving me an error message. What's wrong? >Rick, Buffalo

A: Rick, if you've done what I think you've done, it's a common mistake with Access developers. You cannot put calculations (such as SUM functions) in a page footer. You have to click on View > Report Header/Footer and put your calculation there. We teach this in our Access courses
