A: Michael, the best software we have found for a single user is WinFax which is made by Symantec the Norton people). WinFax has the best features and is only around \$120. It's a snap to set up. If you have an office where many people want to send and receive faxes via computer, we suggest BizFax which is made by Spartacom. It's great for offices of 5 to 100 users. If you send and receive *huge* volumes of faxes (like we do) Amicron offers a custom solution designed for your needs. A: Beth, you could just **Copy** and **Paste** the text of the address from the Web browser "address" line to your Email. If you're using MS Internet Explorer, you can also click on File and Send. You can then send either the entire "page by email" or just a "link" to the page by email. We teach this in our Internet course.

Q: I'm torn between upgrading my current PC and just buying a new one. I currently have a Pentium II 500 with 64 MB of RAM and a 10 GB hard drive. It's fine for most of what I do, but it's a bit slow, especially on the Internet. >Bob, Buffalo

A: Bob, my rule of thumb is don't buy a new PC unless the system you're buying has at least three times the processing power of your current system. In your case, wait for the 1.5 GHz processors to come down (some time this fall, perhaps). In the mean time, even a faster PC won't speed up your Internet connection. That's dependent on your modem and phone line conditions. Perhaps look into a high speed connection like cable or DSL. You can also always add RAM to your PC. Going to 128 MB of RAM will speed up your system's performance.

Q: What should I be doing on a regular basis to make sure the computers in my office are running smoothly? >Peter, Depew

A: Peter, the most important thing is to make sure your tape backups are working. A lot of people we've helped over the years were making backups, but never checking them - and sometimes we found that the backups weren't good. Also, make sure you update your virus scanner files at least monthly. You may also want to run a monthly Scandisk to check for bad sectors on your hard drive, and of course run a Defrag occasionally. One of our affiliates, Don Barker Computer Services, is offering a service that is designed specifically to maintain your office PCs, and take care of all of these routine maintenance items so you don't have to worry about them. The service costs \$100 per month, and you can use it to care for as many PCs as you have in your office – that can be serviced in a two hour period once a month.
