Q: In Microsoft Word, how can I create that neat effect that you have in your newsletter, where the text is white in a black box? > Joseph, Buffalo NY

A: The easiest way to do it is to select your text, use the Highlighter tool on the toolbar to make the background black, and then change the foreground color to white. However, you can also click on Format > Borders & Shading and create a nifty border effect and background shading

Q: In MS Access, can you freeze the columns of a table, like you can in MS Excel? >Mike, Buffalo NY

A: Yes, you can. Simply highlight the column you wish to "freeze" and click on Format > Freeze Columns. Now when you scroll left and right, everything to the left of that column stays put.

A: In Outlook 2000, click on *Tools > Options*then on the Preferences tab click on Email Options. Click on the Tracking Options button. At the bottom, select "Never send a response." Click OK. You're all set.

A: After you set up your presentation, go into the Slide Sorter view and click on Slide Show > Rehearse Timings. Run through your slide show, pausing as long as you think necessary on each slide, and clicking to advance through the slides. When finished, you'll be prompted to record the slide timings. Say yes." Now, click on Slide Show > Set Up Show. Click on the box that says "Loop continuously until Esc." When you run your slide show now, it will loop until you hit the Escape key. A: What you need to do is select the cell, copy it to the clipboard, and the right-click on the cell you wish to paste and select *Paste Special* From the menu that appears, click on *Values* from the top "Paste" section.
